1. www.familyhistoryclass.com. Check out the research links. Go to the list of classes at the BYU family history library every other Sunday, etc.
2. Personal Assistance. Please let us know if you require personal assistance. We or other Family History Consultants will arrange to meet with you.
3. Research Using Google. As you know Google has digitized much of the written material in the USA and in many foreign countries. Accordingly, Google is a great place to do family history research.

If you want to research in a foreign country you will need to enter an identification of the foreign country or area when going to Google. For example research in the United Kingdom would be Google.uk.

To better understand the various rules when using Google please go to the following link and listen to David Barney (a family friend and Google employee) who will walk you through some of the rules. When watching David with his lecture please be patient. The link may come up slowly. His presentation was given at one of the recent Roots Tech Conferences in Salt Lake City.
